Sermon from Christmas Eve Service 2023

Before I begin tonight's message, a couple of quick notes. I am going to refer to Charles M. Schulz as Sparky. He got this nickname from his uncle who named him "Sparky" after the horse Spark Plug in the comic strip *Barney Google*. That would also be a great thing to know for Jeopardy! And now that I think of it, knowing that there was a comic strip named Barney GOOGLE might also be a good thing to know for Jeopardy! AND his name is Charles M. SCHULZ, say it with me: SCHULZ, not SCHUTLZ with a "T" as people incorrectly pronounce it. Schultz is the name of the guard of the prisoner of war camp on the 60s tv show Hogan's Heroes!

A lso, before I start, I got some great advice from my family about doing tonight's service.

"Dad, remember the service is NOT about you!"

"It's Christmas Eve, keep it short, people have things to do!"

Also, I'm sure you all know that I am the 2022 <u>Long Island Herald</u> person of the year and I'll be doing my last public appearance at Cappy's Discount Liquor in Lynbrook on New Year's Eve.

S o, Charlie Brown cries out "Isn't there anyone who knows what Christmas is all about?"

I inus answers "Sure, Charlie Brown, I can tell you what Christmas is all about,"

[Linus walks to center stage.]

"Lights, please."

And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sure afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold,

I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born

this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men.

That reading is from Luke Chapter 2 verses 08-14 King James Version of the Bible

t's April 1965 and the Advertising Agen-L cy McCann Erickson, right here in New York City, is looking for a Christmas Special for its client Coca Cola to sponsor. They approach producer Lee Mendelson and he says, yes I have a Christmas Special. The agency says ok, have an outline for us on Tuesday! He calls his friend Charles Schulz and says "I just sold a "Charlie Brown Christmas Special" to which Sparky responds, "what's that?" And Mendelson says to him, I don't know, but you are going to write it! They get together with animator Bill Melendez on a Thursday afternoon and make an outline. They present it on Monday and on Tuesday the agency says yes! Now they have six months to make the animated Charlie Brown Christmas Special.

They had to figure out so many things. How do these characters: Charlie Brown, Snoopy, Linus, Lucy and the gang, who up until then only existed in a two dimensional space, translate to animation? Who would do the voices? They decided to go with mostly regular kids' voices and some professional child actors, but they were adamant, no adult voices trying to sound like kids.

They also decided on a jazz soundtrack that produced the famous "Linus and Lucy" theme by Vince Guaraldi. The song "Christmas Time Is Here" was originally an instrumental, and there was no one around to write the words, so producer Mendelson wrote the lyrics in fifteen minutes! The voice of Snoopy was just a rough track done by animator Bill Melendez that they decided to keep because it sounded right.

If you can believe it, at this time, the Pea-I nuts comic strip appeared in 2600 newspapers in 75 countries and the animators were trying very hard to keep Peanuts as Peanuts. Then Sparky told the producer that Linus was going to read from the Bible! This had never been done before! They all thought that this was a dangerous thing to do! Animate from the Bible? Sparky said, "Well, if we don't do it, who will?" Schulz had used Bible verse in the comic strip and felt that the Bible was meant for everybody. And Linus's reading from the book of Luke, helps Charlie Brown to deal with his frustration about the commercialism of Christmas.

When the producer and the animator looked at the final cut of the show, they thought that they had ruined Charlie Brown! And the network didn't like it at all. Too Slow! It didn't translate well to television and they had negative comments about the music and the child voices used. But the show was already scheduled in the <u>TV</u> <u>Guide</u>, remember that?, so they had to run it. And before we get to the results, I want to quote the Hollywood sage William Gold-

man, screenwriter of such films as: <u>The</u> <u>Princess Bride</u>, <u>Marathon Man</u>, <u>All The</u> <u>President's Men</u>, and <u>Butch Cassidy and the</u> <u>Sundance Kid</u>. Goldman said "Nobody knows anything..... Not one person in the entire motion picture field knows for a certainty what's going to work. Every time out it's a guess and, if you're lucky, an educated one."

Vell, The Charlie Brown Christmas aired on December 9, 1965 at 7:30 pm. And it was an enormous success! It was the second most watched show that week. pulling in a 49% share, almost half of the televisions in the United States watched it! What was the show that was watched more that week in the number 1 spot? Bonanza! The Charlie Brown Christmas Special was aired EVERY YEAR SINCE THEN, sometimes multiple times in December. It is such a valuable asset that you can only watch it now on Apple TV with a subscription! The show won an Emmy and a Peabody award which was quite a surprise to Sparky because Charlie Brown never won anything!

et us pray. Lord, let us take the lesson of Linus that we learned tonight with us. Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will to-


